Atlanta Contemporary presents *Dark Povera Part 1*, a solo exhibition by Matthew Angelo Harrison

ATLANTA—July 19 – <u>Atlanta Contemporary Art Center</u> (Atlanta Contemporary) is pleased to announce a solo exhibition with Matthew Angelo Harrison.

Matthew Angelo Harrison moves the behind-the-scenes production of his art out from the other side of the curtain for all to see. While many of us think of personal 3D printers as the future, Harrison hand-makes life-sized, low resolution, 'do it yourself' versions to facilitate his creations. Using computer aided design (CAD) files and a 3D scanner, he makes digital copies of traditional African masks and sculptures, with the intent of creating modified reproductions. Harrison's work looks at value and dissemination, labor and consumerism. The artist has mined several private Atlanta collections of African masks that will be displayed alongside their new counterparts. These iterations are tweaked and distorted, each mask behaves like a game of telephone, exposing the imperfections in the latest versions. The further we move away from the original, the further we move from its true intention.

This exhibition continues Atlanta Contemporary's efforts to present and debut newly commissioned work by national/international artists to our community. Harrison's exhibition will be a fully new body of work.

Matthew Angelo Harrison (b. 1989, Detroit, MI) has a BFA from the School of the Art Institute in Chicago. In 2016, he had his first

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museum solo exhibition at MOCAD in Detroit, curated by Jens Hoffmann. He will also be included in the 2016 group exhibition "Take Me (I'm Yours)" at the Jewish Museum in New York, curated by Hans Ulrich Obrist, Jens Hoffmann and Kelly Taxter. He has a forthcoming solo exhibition at University of Michigan Institute for the Humanities and a group exhibition at The Institute of Contemporary Art, Miami, FL. Harrison lives and works in Detroit.
